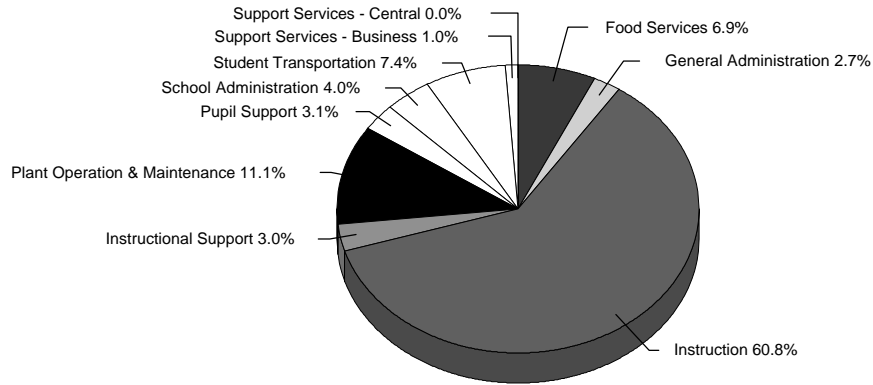
FINANCIAL INFORMATION
