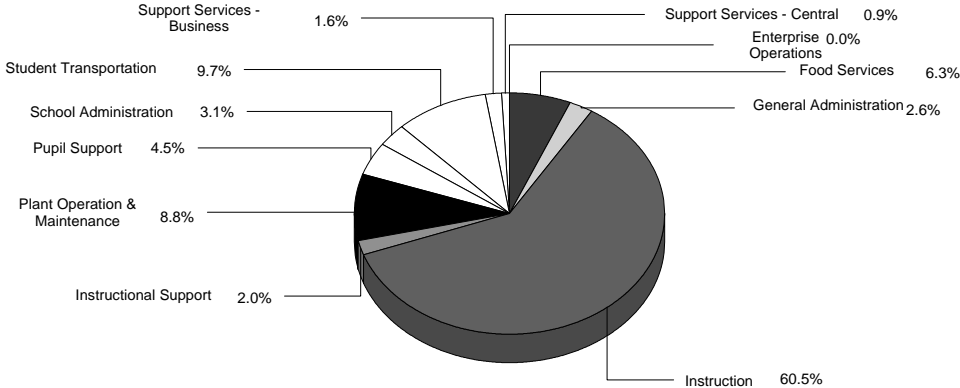
## FINANCIAL INFORMATION
