## MESSAGE FROM THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT

Early Literacy is the foundation for future success in school. The Webster County Early Childhood Program stresses the importance of teaching all children to read well by the end of third grade. Benchmarks for each grade level, research-based instructional strategies, and summer school opportunities provide students with every opportunity to become proficient readers and writers.

Data have indicated an achievement gap exists between early childhood and middle school age students. In order to lessen this gap, Webster County Schools has begun an academic three year Middle School Initiative. This initiative will be funded by blending federal, state, and local funds. Middle school teachers will be involved in professional development workshops which will be designed to enhance their expertise in classroom management, meeting needs of diverse students, research-based teaching strategies, study groups, visitations to exemplary schools, and more. Webster County welcomes the challenge this initiative will bring to its faculty and staff.

At the high school level, we have expanded the number of college class offerings dramatically and increased the number of advanced placement classes, making it possible for a Webster County High School student to graduate with up to 12 college credits.

Our philosophy at Webster County Schools continues to be: "Our children deserve the best. We will not settle for anything less; therefore, we are working daily toward this goal...Why Not The Best!"

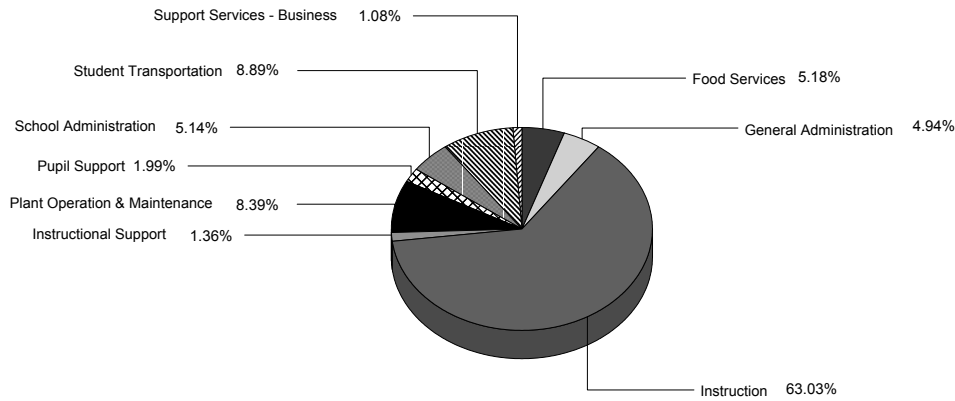
## FINANCIAL INFORMATION
