Why AC^2 ?


Career and Technical Education (CTE) plays a crucial role in empowering Deaf, Hard-of-Hearing, Blind, Low Vision, and Deafblind students by providing them with the knowledge and hands-on experiences necessary to succeed in a competitive workforce. CTE programs are uniquely positioned to offer tailored instruction and adaptive technologies, ensuring that all students, regardless of their sensory abilities, can pursue meaningful careers and achieve their full potential.

WHAT IS ACADEMY FOR CAREER CONNECTIONS?

West Virginia Schools for the Deaf and the Blind's (WVSDB) Academy for Career Connections (AC²) programs empower students to explore potential careers in various hands-on, technical training programs. These programs not only teach students real-world knowledge and skills, but also provide opportunities for industry-recognized credentials and meaningful work-based learning experiences. Students gain hands-on experience to better understand and prepare for high-demand, real-world jobs.

CTE PATHWAY FROM HIGH SCHOOL TO CAREER

Students can begin exploring CTE programs in middle school. Taking these courses in middle and high school can help students decide what direction to take after graduation. CTE classes will better prepare students to be both college and career ready.



Discover Your Future

The Discover Your Future course offered at The West Virginia Schools for the Deaf and the Blind is a transformative course designed to provide middle school-aged students with invaluable career exploration opportunities. By exposing students to different industries and professions early on, they can

HIGH SCHOOL

Simulated Workplace and Work-Based Experiences

Simulated Workplace (SW) is an engaging learning environment that provides students with authentic workplace experiences and the skills they need to be successful in their careers and higher education. Simulated Workplace implements workplace protocols in the classroom that align with West Virginia workforce requirements.

The West Virginia Schools for the Deaf and the Blind offer vital on-campus and off-campus work-based experiences, facilitated in collaboration with the Division of Rehabilitation Services (DRS) and local businesses in Romney, WV. The West Virginia Schools for the Deaf and the Blind is excited to announce a new partnership between The West Virginia Schools for the Deaf and the Blind and Eastern Community and Technical College, dedicated to serving our Deaf, Hard of Hearing, Blind, Low Vision, and Deafblind students. Through this collaboration, WVSDB students will have the opportunity to participate in dual credit courses, gaining college-level experience while still in high school. Additionally, they will receive continued support after graduation, ensuring a smooth transition to higher education and beyond.

CAREER

The WVSDB offers five CTE career academies that provide opportunities for students to explore various potential careers in a wide range of fields and industries. The academy career clusters help students discover their passions and empower them to choose a successful pathway after graduation.

Within each academy cluster, students can choose a program of study to focus on. These programs enhance the high school experience and expand opportunities for students by allowing them to explore various careers within a particular field.





Building Maintenance and Operations is a comprehensive, hands-on program encompassing multiple disciplines and trades involved in residential and commercial construction.

Students will learn aspects from the following: hand tools, power tools, masonry, welding, carpentry, painting, plumbing, HVAC, and electrical. The WVSDB is an accredited training and education facility recognized by the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER). Students can obtain various nationally recognized industry credentials such as OSHA 10, Introduction to Hand Tools, Introduction to Power Tools, Construction Math, Basic Safety, Construction Drawings, Basic Communication, Material Handling, Introduction to HVAC, and Basic Stair Layout. Throughout the program, students construct many different products within the shop and perform work on the WVSDB campus. In addition, students use their skills in the community and build numerous projects for multiple nonprofit organizations.

SKILL SETS

- Identify ways to create and maintain a safe work environment
- ▶ Demonstrate proper use of hand tools (hammer, chisel, cat's paw, tape measure, speed square, and more)
- Exhibit an understanding of construction blueprints
- ▶ Demonstrate proper use of power tools (circular saw, miter saw, pneumatic nail guns, table saw, jig saw, planer, and more)
- ▶ Demonstrate proper installation of basic electrical components
- Demonstrate an understanding of basic welding techniques
- ▶ Demonstrate proper installation of basic plumbing components
- Exhibit an understanding of basic HVAC systems
- Perform multiple duties of a carpenter (building floor systems, wall systems, installing sheathing, shingle installation, and more)

The Personal Career Readiness Academy is dedicated to preparing students for professional success with a focus on personalized pathways tailored to individual career goals.

This program covers essential skills such as resume writing, interview techniques, workplace etiquette, and professional communication. This academy empowers students to confidently transition from academics to the professional world, ensuring they are well-prepared for the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead.

KEY FEATURES

- **Personalized Pathways:** Each student receives a customized plan that aligns with their unique career aspirations, ensuring they acquire the skills and experiences most relevant to their goals.
- **Dual Credit Opportunities:** In partnership with Eastern Community and Technical College, students can earn dual credits, gaining advanced standing and a head-start on their college education.
- ▶ **College Prep:** Our collaboration with Eastern Community and Technical College also provides robust college preparatory courses, equipping students with the knowledge and skills needed for higher education success.
- **Pursue Grow Your Own:** "Grow Your Own" is a program designed for students aspiring to become future educators in West Virginia. This program offers opportunities for high school students to embark on their journey into the teaching profession by earning credits and gaining classroom teaching experience before they graduate.

Designed to provide hands-on experience and industry-relevant knowledge, this program equips students with the essential tools to excel in culinary arts and restaurant management. From mastering knife techniques to understanding menu planning, an invaluable opportunity to gain real-world experience by working in our on-site cafe, students will learn aspects of the hospitality industry under the guidance of an experienced instructor.

SKILL SETS

- ▶ Maintain basic principles of nationally recognized sanitation protocols (ServSafe Food Handler)
- Exhibit understanding of professional behavior, appearance, and job interview skills
- Identify and distinguish safe knife usage and basic cuts
- ▶ Perform basic duties of a waiter. (e.g., take orders, selling techniques, serve properly)
- ▶ Identify food allergen characteristics
- Identify and demonstrate proper use of measuring devices
- Identify large and small kitchen equipment
- ▶ Demonstrate proper use and care of large and small equipment



For students passionate about music, the Music Academy provides in-depth training across various areas of the music industry.

Under the guidance of experienced instructors, students will have the opportunity to explore and develop their musical talents in a supportive and dynamic environment.
